SUBJECT: Unit Streamers

1. References

- a. FM 21-20, September 1992, Army Physical Fitness
- b. DA PAM 350-38, September 1990, Standards of Weapons Training
- c. USAREUR Regulation 350-1, July 2002, Training in USAREUR
- d. Army Regulation 600-8-22, February 1995, Military Awards (Update 15)
- e. Army Regulation 600-9, October 1986, The Army Weight Control Program

2. The purpose of this letter is to establish policies and procedures for the awarding of the Commanding General's Physical Fitness, 5-Mile Unit Run, Discipline, Individual Weaponry, and Crew-Served Weaponry Streamers.

3. There are only two streamers currently awarded in AR 600-8-22. They are the Expert Infantry Streamer and the Expert Medical Streamer. The Expert Infantry Streamer is awarded to a unit that has 65 percent or more assigned strength having been awarded the Expert Infantryman Badge or Combat Infantry Badge. The Expert Medical Streamer is awarded to units that have 65 percent or more assigned strength having been awarded the Expert Field Medical Badge or Combat Medical Badge.

4. The CG's APFT Streamers will be awarded to all companies who meet or exceed the following standards:

- a. **Gold** – a company average of 270 points, no APFT failures, and all overweight personnel enrolled in the Overweight Program IAW AR 600-9.
- b. **Silver** – a company average of 250 points, no APFT failures, and all overweight personnel enrolled in the Overweight Program IAW AR 600-9.
- c. **Bronze** – a company average of 230 points, no APFT failures, and all overweight personnel enrolled in the Overweight Program IAW AR 600-9.

5. The CG's 5-Mile Unit Run Streamer will be awarded to all companies who meet or exceed the following standards:

- a. Complete a unit run in formation over a 5-mile course in 45 minutes.
- b. Complete the run with 90 percent or more of the company's assigned soldiers.
- c. Soldiers with medical profiles that prohibit running will not count against the unit strength.

6. The CG's Individual Weaponry Streamers will be awarded to all companies who meet or exceed the following standards for all of their assigned individual weapons:

- a. **Gold** – a 70 percent expert qualification with 100 percent qualification.
- b. **Silver** – a 60 percent expert qualification with 100 percent qualification.
- c. **Bronze** – a 50 percent expert qualification with 100 percent qualification.

7. The CG's Crew-Served Weaponry Streamers will be awarded to all companies who meet or exceed the following standards for all of their assigned crew-served weapons:

- a. **Gold** – a 70 percent expert qualification with 100 percent qualification.
- b. **Silver** – a 60 percent expert qualification with 100 percent qualification.
- c. **Bronze** – a 50 percent expert qualification with 100 percent qualification.

8. The CG's Discipline Streamers will be awarded to all companies who meet or exceed the following standards:

- a. **Gold** – no accidents or blotter incidents involving alcohol, drugs, or other acts of indiscipline for a period of 2 years.
- b. **Silver** – no accidents or blotter incidents involving alcohol, drugs, or other acts of indiscipline for a period of 1 year.
- c. **Bronze** – no accidents or blotter incidents involving alcohol, drugs, or other acts of indiscipline for a period of 6 months.

9. In order to request one, or more, of the above-listed streamers, units must submit a memorandum for the CG through the first O-5 in the chain of command to G3 Training for verification. Once G3 Training has verified that the unit has met the requirements for a streamer, the SGS office will coordinate for delivery and presentation of the streamers.

10. Units earning the above-listed streamers may display them for 6 months from the date G3 Training verifies that the requirements have been met, or until they no longer meet the requirements for display of the streamer, whichever occurs first. Only one level of a streamer may be displayed on a guidon at any one time. For example, a unit earns the Bronze PT Streamer. Four months later, a PT Test is conducted and the unit now qualifies for a Silver PT Streamer. The Bronze Streamer will be removed and returned to the SGS, while the Silver Streamer will be attached to the guidon.
