### MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Policy Memorandum 2: Drug and Alcohol Abuse

1. Drug and alcohol abuse will not be tolerated in the 121 Signal Battalion. Abuse of this kind can result in the loss of life or serious injury. Abuse detracts from our mission accomplishment and often destroys family life.
2. Drug abuse will be met with the most stringent sanction available. Company commanders will continue to test their soldiers to the 200% level annually and will refer all drug cases to my level for action.
3. Alcohol abuse is a key factor in most serious incidents in the battalion and local area. Serious incidents involving alcohol will be treated severely by myself. Those soldiers and family members who seek to and actually do work to reduce dependency on alcohol will be provided every support and encouragement to overcome their addiction.
4. Commanders must ensure that staff duty and charge of quarters soldiers take the responsibility for ensuring that soldiers who are impaired by drugs and alcohol do not depart the barracks.
